WHAT CAN THE POLICE DO FOR YOU?

The police are here to protect you if you are a victim of violence, or if you are forced to do something you do not want to do.

- Police officers are reliable people.
- ▼ The police will NOT cause you harm.
- You should NOT be punished for something that you were forced to do, even if it is wrong/ against the law.

WHAT IS HUMAN TRAFFICKING?

You or one of your friends may be a victim of trafficking, without realising it.

Have you been in a situation in which you had to:

- ↗ have sex or perform sexual acts?
- work (for example, in someone's house doing housework or childcare, a factory or a restaurant)?
- → beg, steal or commit crime?
- grow, carry or deal drugs?
- → remove your organs to sell?
- Repay a 'debt' by working or providing some other service?

Have you/your family been threatened?

If you answer "yes" to one of these questions, you or your friend may be victim of trafficking.

- If you are from another country, you may need permission to stay in Germany. This means you have to apply for asylum or a residence permit. You can apply for asylum with the help of your guardian/caretaker.
- You will be interviewed by someone from the Federal Office for Migration and Refugees (BAMF) and you can be accompanied by your guardian/ caretaker.
- Remember, you do not need official documents or immigration status to benefit from the child protection system.
- If you have no parents, a guardian will be appointed in order to support you. If you don't feel at ease we your can trust him or her. your guardian, or if you not lf you don't have a guardian, that he or she does speak to your caretaker or to the youth welfare service.
- The guardian will make sure that your rights are respected. includes This access to medical/psychological care, to school and to appropriate accommodation. If you are a migrant your quardian will also support the process of asylum application.
- If you don't feel at ease with your guardian, or if you notice that he or she does not respect his/her duties, do not hesitate to contact someone from the youth welfare service. They will assign a new guardian with whom you will feel comfortable.

In Germany, as a child, you have a right to a free lawyer and free psychosocial support.

- The information you will share with your lawyer is absolutely confidential. Do not hesitate to tell him/her about your story, even if you have told another story before.

Social Workers are trusted adults. Their job is to help you. They will help you get access to free assistance (food, accommodation, doctors, school...) and make sure your rights are respected. They work in places like counselling centres or in youth centres.



YOU CAN TELL YOUR DOCTOR ABOUT ANY MEDICAL PROBLEMS YOU ARE EXPERIENCING.

HEALTH

You have the right to a free doctor.

AGE ASSESSMENT

Being a child gives you access to specific protections. Authorities may want to check your age to make sure you are a child. Therefore, it is always better to tell the truth about your age.

How can your age be checked?

Verification of ID papers / birth certificate / travel documents

Interview with a professional

Medical examination (by a doctor of your gender)

- → You have the right to contest the result of the age assessment. Ask your guardian or someone you trust to help you.
- As a refugee you don't have to tolerate medical examination for age assessment (e.g. by x-ray)

EDUCATION IS FREE IN GERMANY

- It is an obligation for German children to go to school.
- → For foreign children, there is a right to go to school.



You should ask professionals (caretakers, guardians) to help you to find a school. It is important to be in contact with others in your age group.
